

INTRODUCTION

You Are a Bible Investigator!

You may not know it yet, but you are an investigator—a Bible investigator! It's a job that God gives to all people who love him, even kids. An investigator is a detective who looks for clues and who puzzles out the truth.

GOOD BIBLE INVESTIGATORS...

- Observe: They pay attention to what they're reading.
- 1 Interpret: They figure out what the Bible means in that section.
- Apply: They decide how the truth of God's Word impacts their life today.


There are a great many truths in life to be found—some interesting, some boring, and some that really matter. You can be the kind of investigator who spends time puzzling out important truth so that you can know a lot of the knowable knowledge that God has given us. That's right. God, the Creator of the universe, gave you a great big letter from him to explore and study so that you can discover the truths that really matter to your life!

In God's letter to you, the Bible, God tells you who he is, who you are, all about his great big plan for salvation, and how you can live for Jesus. The Bible is also a book of history: not boring history, with weird dates and dry descriptions, but an exciting story about the Ruler of all things and his people.

This Bible-investigator book is all about *Creation*. Why is Creation capitalized? Well, that's because Creation was a one-time event that happened at a specific time and place in history. God's story about Creation is told in Genesis 1 – 3. Those three chapters will help you learn how God created all things. God also put clues all over the Bible to help you understand more about him and his amazing creation. Creation that isn't capitalized refers to all the nouns—people, creatures, plants, and even planets—that God created.

This book of puzzles will help you really think about Creation Bible verses. Even better, this is a book of clues. Once you do the detective work to learn more about

how our Creator God created, you'll know some truths that really matter. Let's get started on this amazing puzzle God has given us.



SECTION ONE



God Created Everything in the Beginning

CHAPTER 1: GOD CREATED ALL THINGS OUT OF NOTHING

An investigator or detective faces two very important questions:

- First, who am I looking for?
- Second, what did that person do?

Detectives start every investigation with clues about *what* happened. As Bible detectives, we want to learn *who God is*. But, we're going to start this investigation with *what God did*.

God tells us what he did in the beginning of time right at the very beginning of the Bible! In just a minute, you'll do a crossword puzzle to find the words to your first verse. As you work on it, think about what God tells you in those words.

As a Bible investigator, you'll notice that God was in the beginning. There was nothing before him. Nobody created God! You will also see, my detective friend, that God created everything out of nothing. Now, there is a very special term for this truth, which Bible investigators need to know. That term is in Latin. Why? Well, for a long time, the Christian Church used Latin as a way to make sure every theologian (that's a really big word for a Bible investigator who studies God) could understand every other theologian, no matter which language they spoke.

You don't need to speak Latin to be a Bible investigator. No one actually does *speak* it, because Latin is a dead language. Only some words are still used by theologians (Bible investigators!) and scientists. You can learn a few important terms, though, that will set you on the path to becoming a more skilled Bible investigator. Let's look at two Latin words.

- EX From or Out of
- NIHILO Nothing

Do you remember that God created all things from absolutely nothing? Theologians use ex nihilo to refer to the second part of our first verse: God tells us that he

made everything out of nothing. We've just started investigating, and you're already learning a secret code and finding new clues. You're pretty good at this Bible detective job!


MY INVESTIGATOR NOTEBOOK

Bible investigators don't just learn important truths—they share those truths with others. Think about sharing your new code words and the amazing work God has done with a sibling or a friend.

• Psalm 33:8-9 is a Bible clue that relates to your first Creation verse. Write out Psalm 33:8-9 from the Bible version of your choice. • Take a walk outside and list or draw some of the things you see, which God created out of nothing. This week, remember to thank God for the world he made. • List the important code words you just learned and what they mean!



MY INVESTIGATOR NOTEBOOK

A Bible investigator *observes* what the Bible says. Remember, pay close attention to what the words of the Bible tell you about God and his plan for salvation, humans and their need for a Savior, and Jesus' commands for his followers.

• Observe: List everything you learned about God and the earth in Genesis 1:1-2a.

A Bible investigator *observes* what God's Word says. Then, a good investigator *interprets* the Bible. What is God telling us in his Word? We don't have to guess! The Bible interprets the Bible. That means that God often explains or comments on what he said in his Holy Spirit-inspired Word in another part of the Bible.

In Genesis 1:1-2a, we *observe* that God created the heavens and the earth. The earth was empty and dark and without form.

You copied Psalm 33:8-9, which helps you *interpret* Genesis 1:1-2a. Psalm 33:8-9 tells you to praise God because he spoke everything into existence. So when you praise and thank God for the wonderful things he has made, that is one way you can *apply* what you've learned in Genesis 1:1-2a.

You're really becoming a Bible investigator now. You're learning to connect clues so you can really understand what God is saying to us through his Word.

Let's look at one more verse that tells us God really did create everything out of nothing. Do you remember your Latin code words for that truth? Write them below.



On the next page there is a rebus puzzle. It uses pictures and letters to form words or phrases.

Figure out the best word for each picture, add or subtract the letters shown, and then write each word in the correct space to reveal a verse written by God's prophet Jeremiah.



In your own words, write definitions for the following terms:

• "Observe"



God made the heavens and the earth. That may sound like he only created two things. But, the phrase "the heavens and the earth" is a *merism*.

A merism is a figure of speech—or a way of expressing an idea—that talks about two different concepts but also includes everything in between. So, "God created the heavens and the earth" means God made the heavens and the earth *and* everything in between.
