


A SIY Serpent

God punishes Sin


Sadly, Eve listened to the lies of the serpent and sinned


A Careful Dove

Animal stories also capture their attention, and are usually those with which younger children identify most readily. The description of the animals in Noah's Ark is surely the one least likely to be forgotten!

Bible Animals (for ages 5+) goes one step further; it uses a collection of animal stories drawn from Scripture, to present important, basic Bible truths. What is sin? Why did Jesus die? Why do bad things sometimes happen? Why is obedience important? These are issues about which positive Godhonouring attitudes can be formed in the early years.
