
Discovering the Truth About Dinosaurs

Holding a child's attention while reading with them is absolutely paramount if you want them to learn from what you are reading together. This book is a winner on three fronts:


- The beautiful illustrations command attention children love animals and dinosaurs are the top favourites;


Philip and Alison have produced a book worthy of a place in any home. I am honoured to have been asked to write this foreword.





These creatures included the splendid and strange; which though now extinct were part of God's range.




Terrible lizards, of sky, sea and land; God made these great monsters just by his command.




Some think that the Bible is not a true word, "A six-day creation", they say, "is absurd!"

but compared to such claims, God's Scriptures outshine!






Those dinosaurs dazzled, of that we are sure, "But why", people ask, "do we see them no more?"






That question is answered in Genesis three; our first parents sinned, eating fruit from that tree.
